# What goes where?

**NO plastic bags, clingfilm, cartons/tetra packs or polystyrene**



## White recycling sack

- ✓ Plastic bottles
- ✓ Food trays
- ✓ Boxes
- ✓ Yoghurt pots
- ✓ and many more

**Please Wash & Squash your rigid plastics before you recycle them**



## Blue recycling sack

- ✓ All cardboard boxes
- ✓ Cereal boxes
- ✓ Egg boxes
- ✓ Food packaging
- ✓ Greeting cards

**Cut cardboard into sections no larger than 1m x 1m.**



## Black recycling box

- ✓ Newspapers, letters, general paper and junk mail
- ✓ Magazines, thin catalogues and brochures
- ✓ Telephone directories and Yellow Pages
- ✓ Shredded paper provided it is inside a paper bag or large paper envelope
- ✓ Food and drinks cans (please wash and squash)
- ✓ EMPTY aerosol cans (do not squash)
- ✓ Glass bottles and jars (please wash)
- ✓ Envelopes (please remove plastic windows from window envelopes)



## Green food waste caddy

- ✓ Food - cooked and uncooked
- ✓ Eggs and egg shells
- ✓ Meat and fish, including bones and skin
- ✓ Cheese and other dairy products
- ✓ Tea bags and coffee grounds
- ✓ Animal hair
- ✓ Raw and cooked fruit and vegetables
- ✓ Cat and dog food
- ✓ Used kitchen roll and paper tissues
- ✓ Bread, cakes and pastry
- ✓ Small amount of liquids, oil and fat (including solid fats such as lard)



## Green wheeled bin

- ✓ Grass cuttings, plants and weeds
- ✓ Food waste
- ✓ Twigs and small branches up to 5cm (2in)
- ✓ Tree stumps up to 10cm (4in) across
- ✓ Windfalls from the garden
- ✓ Cold wood ash
- ✓ Leaves, bark and tree prunings
- ✓ Kitchen roll and tissues
- ✓ Vegetable waste from the garden (e.g. potato tops)
- ✓ Cut flowers
- ✓ Real Christmas trees (2-3ft sections)
- ✓ Bedding from herbivore pets (rabbits etc)



## Grey wheeled bin

- ✓ Any other household waste that can't be recycled
- ✓ Remember to use council-issued beige sacks for additional refuse

## Please Note:

All wheeled bin lids must be fully closed. We will not collect any additional waste placed alongside your bin unless it is in beige refuse bags, which can be purchased from the Council Offices in Cirencester and also the Council's Moreton Area Office.
