

The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

As I write this, the conflict in Aleppo in Syria is reaching a horrific climax with the fate of many thousands uncertain.

But even after the last cluster bomb has fallen and last mortar is silent, what remains is every bit as awful as the current bombardment and destruction.

The rebuilding of homes is one thing. But the rebuilding of lives and relationships is entirely another. Some will never recover.

And all we can do, here in our comparative comfort, is to watch and weep. I know I do. A few years ago I spent time in Syria, including Aleppo. It was a thriving city with a joyful, welcoming population.

When confronted by such situations, as individuals we feel helpless. Yes, we can support those working with refugees in this country and overseas. But what more can we do?

There is an old 'modern' chorus we sing in church that says 'Let there be peace on earth, and let it begin with me'.

It easy to sit in our armchairs and criticise the actions of others thousands of miles away. But if we are committed to living in a peaceful world, we must begin where we are. We can do that by ensuring we reach out to those we have hurt or harmed, by being the first to make peace with family or neighbours, by building bridges with those we think have hurt us.

At the beginning of another year, let's resolve to make our lives, homes and community a truly peaceful place.

May God bless you in this coming year with His peace.

The **next meeting** of the Parish Council will be at 8.00 pm in the Hunters Hall on Tuesday 31 January.

Planning Applications

- Demolition of existing Bagpath Court Cottage and erection of replacement dwelling including associated development.
- Lasborough Park, Tetbury ammendments to details of potting shed design.

Planning Approvals

• Lasborough Park, Tetbury - repair of ice house including reforming of front elevation. Retrospective consent for opening in walled garden wall. Formation of new walled parting area complete with access gates.

• Cherry Tree House, Kingscote - Lime tree, reduce canopy by 33%, lift canopy to 6M to remove low trailing branches. Yew tree, remove projecting branches to shape and tidy appearance.

Bus service through Kingscote discontinued - Despite intense lobbying by the Parish Council this is now confirmed, due to the cost and extremely low usage by Kingscote residents.

Footpaths - There are concerns about low hanging branches over footpaths which are a threat to the eyes of pedestrians. It is not easy to look where one is placing ones feet on the path as well as to check overhead.

Restoration and Improvement of the Church

Work inside the Church is now complete. The new gravel footpath from the tarmac path to Jo's Gate at the south end is very smart. No doubt as the trench settles we will need to replenish the gravel to keep the surface clean and dry. The emphasis now is on tidying up the front of the churchyard for the wedding on 12 February.

The disposal of spoil from the trenching is proving to be a challenge, involving manual sorting of the larger stones and rocks for disposal off-site. The recent weather has not helped. The pile of spoil by the oil tank will have to take its time, but with the stones removed will be spread evenly over the grass behind the church.

We have recently received grants of £2,000 from the Gloucestershire Historic Churches Trust and £2,500 from the Garfield Weston Foundation which are greatly appreciated.
