

The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

Do you think that we live in an open and welcoming community? Do think that we are truly aware of the need of those around us?

Age UK are currently running a campaign to highlight the problem of loneliness, particularly amongst older people.

A survey they did showed that more than a million people had gone for over a month without speaking to a friend, neighbour or family member.

Their campaign aim is to make local and national government understand that older people's loneliness really matters; that is a a serious public health problem and not a normal part of ageing, and they want them to commit to take action to prevent and tackle it. Strong words and a worthy aim.

However, loneliness within communities will only really be tackled when those living there become more aware or the needs of their neighbours and begin to do something about it.

Jesus stood in the synagogue having read these words from Isaiah, "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour." He then sat down saying that these words had been fulfilled in their hearing.

Jesus' priority was to bring life in all its fullness, and our calling as Christians is to do that work.

We can set people free from the loneliness of old age by being better neighbours and friends to those around us. We don't have to wait for Governments!

Let's keep a close eye on people near us and flag up any who could do with a bit of company and a chance to talk and to listen.

An update on the 2016 Church Restoration Appeal

Many, many thanks to all those who have contributed to the 2016 Restoration Appeal. The new flooring on the south side of the nave is complete and with the new damp protection measures underneath, should be there for many years.

The footpath trench has, among other things, enabled us to renew the old unsafe electrical cable to the Lychgate lights, and the new gravel is settling down to form a clean well drained solid surface.

Delays and over budget costs have arisen but we are working our way through these. While excavating the trench at the west door, several, pieces of medieval worked stone were found, and although exciting from an archaeological aspect, it has caused problems from a financial and project management point of view. Work had to be halted, while an archaeologist at a cost of £220 per day had to assess the findings, make scale drawings, and attend subsequent excavation work on a watching brief. Depending on the outcome of the report, he may have to carry out further work. This, along with attendant architect fees, has inevitably increased the overall costs, and caused us to review the plans for the next stage of drainage work around the church building.

In the meantime, we are very grateful to <u>all those who have contributed</u> to enable the work that has been completed to date, namely:

Our immediate priority is to tidy up the front of the churchyard for the wedding on 12 February.

The Coptic Orthodox Church

Extracted from an article by His Grace Bishop Angaelos, Bishop of the Coptic Church in the UK, published in The Times on 7 January 2017

The Coptic Orthodox Church, which makes up 15% of the population of Egypt and 80% of the overall Christian presence in the Middle East, continues to face struggles closely connected to the issue of religious freedom.

Most recently 27 people in the congregation, mostly women and children, lost their lives in the heartbreaking and tragic bombing of St Peter's Coptic Orthodox Church in Cairo on 11 December.

Whilst the majority of Muslims in Egypt have condemned this and similar attacks over the years, there remains a fringe element that has a fundamental issue with the mere presence of this indigenous Christian community.

While attacks on the faithful are not uncommon, the Church within Egypt and abroad continues to be pragmatic and resilient in its life and witness. The spirit of forgiveness and reconciliation that has been demonstrated time and again after

violent attacks against Christian communities across the Middle East is again a reminder of the spirit of the infant Christ, who brought a message of hope and forgiveness indiscriminately to all.

The Coptic Orthodox community has been present in Britain since the mid-Sixties, and its 20,000 members are served by 30 parishes across the UK. For this community, Christmas is a sacred time of celebrating its faith, its heritage and its origins while continuing to be faithful and productive in its contribution to the day-to-day life of its new home, and remembering Egypt in prayer.
