Fly Tipping

Many thanks to so many of you who have contacted us regarding the fly tipping in Windmill Lane. I thought I would share with you what I have written in my monthly Gloucestershire Chairman's NFU blog:

Frustratingly, we have had a lot of builder's rubbish tipped in one of our fields. Whenever I meet MPs and the Chief Constable of Gloucestershire to discuss fly tipping I illustrate that we farm within one mile of a Recycling Centre, and the problem is that anyone wth a pick-up or a van has to book in, giving 24 hours notice. Some of these people that are turned way because they have not booked in, are not going to take it home when they can dump it in the nearest farmer's field. Sometimes the Police and the Council do themselves no favours.
