#### Whitsunday 9 June 2019 - historical background

#### Pentecost Wikipedia

The Christian holy day of Pentecost which is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter, commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ whilst they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Jewish Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles (Chapter 2 verses 1 to 31). In Christian tradition, this event represents the birth of the early Church. The Holy Day is also called 'White Sunday' or 'Whitsunday' especially in the UK.

#### Historic images of the Holy Spirit

After Jesus was baptised by John the Baptist in the river Jordan it was recorded in the gospel, of Luke that the Holy Spirit had descended on him like a dove (Luke Chapter 3 verses 21 to 23). This image has been used in many works of art and architecture thereafter. Later, after Jesus had ascended to heaven, at Pentecost the Holy Spirit came down to the apostles collectively in a fiery other worldly event which changed them forever and inspired them to devote the rest of their lives to spreading the Christian Faith around the Middle East.

#### The first meeting of Gertrude Jekyll and Edwin Lutyens

The accomplished and recognised 45 years old Arts and Crafts practitioner Gertrude Jekyll first met the 20 years old bright eyed aspiring architect Edwin Lutyens at a tea party in 1889 at the home of a Surrey rhododendron-fancier. They spoke little at the table, but she was clearly impressed. At the end of the party she spoke to the young man and invited him to visit her Garden at Munstead Wood, which did not have an associated house.

A garden without a house is like a portrait without a face. Now Lutyens realised why he had been invited - he was being offered the first major commission of his career.

#### The demise of the UK steel making industry

To one born in Scunthorpe and brought up on Teesside the gradual demise of steel making is tragic but inevitable. The basic raw materials of iron ore and coal have had to be shipped from the far-east for the past half century, whilst the supply of cheap steel from China has captured the world market.

Steel making is not a 'boys game'. Whilst from the outside steelworks are grim, dirty and ugly, what goes on inside is awesome. Molten steel is alive, dangerous

and heavy to handle, and the stages of the process from the roaring blast furnace though the hot refining processes which produce high quality steel, all involve huge amounts of energy. The hot rolling process which creates girders and plates is a spectacular sight.

The major processes are essentially continuous, depending on demand. The work force have always been totally dedicated and committed, and when it was obvious that a major explosion had occurred, the workers who knew they would be needed would turn out automatically. Night time bombing during WW2 was horrendous. When plants are closed down grown men are in tears.
