

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

- 1. The Parish Council Annual Meeting will be held by Zoom on May 4th at 7.30pm.

 Subsequently, we hope that it will be possible for a physical Annual Parish Meeting to be held but the date will depend on the relaxation of Covid restrictions
- 2. Fibre Broadband
- a. Gigaclear contractors have completed installation of fibre broadband through the central part of Kingscote village. We believe this work will be extended to the remaining parts of the parish but we have not yet received a schedule for completing the work. b. BT are also planning to install fibre broadband in Kingscote! BT (Openreach) will be closing the road between the phone box and the church from 14-25 June to install a new duct, and subsequently the road from the phone box to Hunter's Hall will be closed. There will be signs in place and a contact number available before the work starts.

3. Highways issues

Gloucestershire Highways have jetted the drains near Hunter's Hall, so we hope they will cope with the next downpour. Blocked drains in the Hazlecote Valley remain listed for jetting in the future.

The worst of the potholes in the Hazlecote Valley have been patched and the large one on the road to Windy Corner in Bagpath is marked for repair.

Kingscote Parish Council

Editor's Notes re Broadband (with thanks to residents who have shared information they have discovered from a variety of sources - which they provide with the caveat that these are the responses they received at the time; not all points may represent the formal position and things can change).

Gigaclear have confirmed that the main cabinet serving Kingscote is now live. This means that residents in the village should be able to place an order for fibre broadband service by 28th May. If they have registered on the website at gigaclear.com, they will be notified that their connection is ready for service via an email.

Regarding other parts of the parish and Gigaclear broadband supply rollout, the message received from Fastershire is - 'For other properties in this section the network build continues and is currently projected to complete in guarter 3 this year'.

Openreach (BT) fibre provision - Those who have already contacted Fastershire and Gloucestershire County Council to query this second fibre broadband installation in Kingscote are being informed that although Fastershire conducted a full industry consultation at the procurement stage to check commercial companies' plans, those private companies can amend their plans and choose to invest to provide their own fibre broadband infrastructure as they wish, and regardless of Fastershire's plans, as it is a competitive market.

Openreach is providing the upgraded infrastructure (5 new poles on the A4135 and around 500m of ducts in the village). Ducts are scheduled to be dug during June and cabling completed by September 2021. The contractors will erect the necessary signage before any road closures. Initial enquiries indicate that no new green cabinets will be erected in the village itself and no further 'black boxes' (the roadside pots) will be needed outside premises. As with Gigaclear a number of partner organisations will use the Openreach infrastructure.

Residents making specific enquiries to Gloucestershire County Council about road closures in the village during June seem to be getting slightly different information about which roads cannot be accessed and when, but details will hopefully become clearer during May.

The churchyard is a credit to our community and gives great pleasure to residents and visitors.

We need a few new members of the mowing team and we invite some of the newcomers and others in the village to join us. The general process is as follows:

- \cdot Members select a section of the churchyard which they would like to take on. Obviously in times of vacation others may help.
- The church has one robust Hayterette mower and a Makita strimmer which are stored in the shed in the churchyard. These machines are given a full professional service at the beginning of each year and repaired by the church when necessary.
- · Cans of fuel and oil are kept in the shed.
- · Some members of the team prefer to use their own machines which they service at their expense.
- · The keys to the mower shed are normally kept in the church beneath the tower, although at the moment this may be locked so the key can be borrowed from 3 The Walled Garden
