PLANNING APPLICATIONS

At the time of composing this month's newsletter there were no planning applications in the parish on the CDC website which had consultation dates for September.

Note - Only applications classed by CDC as 'current' and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Forerunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be around 21 days after validation of the application by CDC although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

If you are keen to keep abreast of all new planning applications it is recommended that you check the CDC website regularly and/or register to receive email alerts direct from CDC.

CHURCH ITEMS FOR SALE AT WOTTON AUCTION ROOMS IN SEPTEMBER 2022

In the Faculty which was approved in early 2022, the PCC (Parochial Church Council) received permission for works in St John the Baptist Church, Kingscote (balustrade for ringing chamber, floor and door repairs). As part of the faculty, we also received permission to dispose of certain items which have been in storage in the ringing chamber for several decades. The items are pictured adjacent and they will be on sale from Wotton Auction Rooms in September.

Some of the items came from Bartholomew's Church, Newington Bagpath when it was closed in the 1970s and some are believed to be linked to the Victorian architect Teulon. The following link will contain more information in due course; https://www.wottonauctionrooms.co.uk/
