to God's call and trusted him to lead her.



PLANNING APPLICATIONS

At time of publishing the newsletter, the following application was listed as current and had an October consultation deadline

3 Lower Hazlecote Cottages- certificate of use of land as garden (existing use/development). Consultation deadline is 6th October.

Note - Only applications classed by CDC as 'current' and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Forerunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be around 21 days after validation of the application by CDC although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

Floor, west door and balustrade work in the church

You may have noticed that work has commenced in the church to repair the west door. Other work which is either in progress or will soon be carried out are repairs to the nave floor and to put in place a balustrade on the ringing chamber, in front of the west window in the tower.

We are most grateful to everyone who helped with the fundraising for these projects- from supporting fundraising events such as the Autumn Fete in 2021 and those who have made donations.

We particularly thank Sandy Childress whose donation has enabled the west window balustrade work. That is the window facing hers and Brooks's home when they lived in Church Cottage. I lived at Church Cottage for 15 wonderful years (in England for 20) which is the longest I've lived in any home, anywhere."
