VICAR'S LETTER

Dear friends,

In May the Christian church celebrated Ascension, when Jesus ascended to be with his Father and at the end of May we celebrated Pentecost, when we remember the Holy Spirit descending on God's people and we celebrate the birth of the Christian Church. At Pentecost the Holy Spirit came to guide and help his followers to proclaim the gospel and spread the love of God.

The ten days between Ascension Day and Pentecost are traditionally days of concerted prayer for the church. Jesus called the disciples to wait and pray for God's power through the Holy Spirit and each year for 11 days from Ascension to Pentecost the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, give an annual invitation to prayer. The focus is specific prayer in churches, households and as individuals for friends, families, communities and countries to come to know the saving love of God in Jesus Christ, and for ourselves that, empowered by God's Spirit, we would grow in confidence to serve, and show and tell of God's love.


At the King's coronation, the service liturgy had at the heart the message of service and the prayers included asking God that the Holy Spirit would strengthen and guide him in the tasks and duties ahead.

When a priest baptises a child or adult, that person is baptised in the name of the father, the son and the Holy Spirit and we pray for the person, for those who care for them and for the world. That they will be guided in their future years and strengthened by the Holy Spirit. Whether you are person of faith in God or not, the church is a place where love and peace can be found, where celebrations, services of thanksgiving and remembrance take place. A place where all are welcome including Pets. On 18th June, we will have a special Pet Service, where you are welcome to bring your pets for a blessing.

Refreshments are always served after the services, so do join us following a service for that time of hospitality and conversation.







PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The parish is very lucky to have such a committed and enthusiastic number of local community volunteers. In addition to our volunteer parish councillors, many other people in the community carry out valuable voluntary activities and these unsung heroes were all acknowledged during the 'Bring and Share' event for the Coronation held on 7 May 2023. The Chair of the Parish Council would particularly like to thank Alice Cooper who stepped down recently after many years as webmaster for Kingscote Online.

The Annual Parish Meeting took place at 7.30pm on Tuesday 16th May and our local volunteers were further celebrated with a display of photographs of many of them. Around a dozen parishioners were in attendance including all of the Parish Councillors. An annual Parish Council update report was given by Councillor Tony Wooldridge and this was followed by an update on the last year's Village Hall activities by Brian McTear. This was followed by a church update by the Reverend Caroline Bland. Our volunteer footpath warden, Julian Foxon, also provided a presentation detailing their work within the community. All of these reports will be available within the next few days along with the draft minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting on the Parish Council website.





The meeting was updated with the fact that the two parish defibrillators have had new pads purchased and Councillors Steve Teague and Beth Calland have taken responsibility for facilitating regular checks of the maintenance and condition of the Kingscote and Bagpath devices respectively.

The Parish Council AGM took place on conclusion of the Annual Parish Meeting. The annual accounts were presented and approved and will be uploaded to the Parish Council Website within the next few days.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

At time of drafting the newsletter, there were no applications listed on the CDC website with a consultation date in June.

Note- Only applications classed by CDC as 'current', using the keyword Kingscote (i.e. the parish), and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Forerunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be around 21 days after validation of the application by CDC although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

If you are keen to keep abreast of all new planning applications, it is recommended that you check the CDC website regularly and/or register to receive email alerts direct from CDC.
