PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

1. Speeding and parking in Kingscote village

We met with the GCC Highways deputy manager for our area on 25 August to discuss ways of reducing speeding and parking problems in Kingscote, and developed proposals for some SLOW signs on the road and white (H-lines) near the sharp corners. Thank you to all residents who responded to the consultation about these proposals. We will consider all the responses before deciding what action to request from GCC Highways. We will also continue to explore the feasibility of some "20 is Plenty" signs.

2. Preparing for winter

We have been liaising with GCC Highways to arrange for all salt bins in the parish to be replenished before the winter. We have also arranged for a reserve supply of bagged salt so that we can top up bins if we have a harsh winter. Since there were no salt bins in the Hazlecote valley we have placed one on each hill. Unfortunately, Kingscote village is likely to be removed from the secondary gritting schedule because the lorries used are too large for the narrow roads. However, we are expecting to have some large salt bins with lids provided in the village.

3. Maintenance of village infrastructure

You may have noticed that the village notice board by the church has been removed for repair and refurbishment and we are grateful to Steve Teague for offering to do this. GCC Highways have agreed to replace the rusting signpost near the postbox T-junction.

4. Community engagement with the Matara Centre

Mr Geoffrey Higgins, the owner of the Matara Centre, is generous in allowing parishioners to access the main field and he would like to increase engagement with the community. There will be a community event on Sunday 1 October at 11.00am to discuss the Centre's long-term vision and opportunities for volunteering to help with maintenance. This will be followed by a 'bring and share' picnic lunch and a walk around the grounds.

The next meeting of Kingscote Parish Council will be on Tuesday 26th September at 7.30pm in the village hall. All parishioners are welcome to attend.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

At time of drafting the newsletter (14th September), there were no applications listed on the CDC website with a consultation deadline in October.

Note- Only applications classed by CDC as 'current', using the keyword Kingscote (i.e. the parish), and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Forerunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be around 21 days after validation of the application by CDC although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

If you are keen to keep abreast of all new planning applications, it is recommended that you check the CDC website regularly and/or register to receive email alerts direct from CDC.
