Vicar's letter

Dear Friends,

Jesus said 'Love one another as I have loved you.'

November is a month that is marked as a special month for remembering those we love and those who have loved us. Churches in the UK and many across the world will hold special services where people will gather to remember.

In our benefice, on 5th November, we will remember those who have died and were close to us as family, or in friendship at the Remembering Loved one's service at St George's Nailsworth. It is a time when the names of loved ones will be read and candles lit as we remember them.

On 12th November, a Remembrance Sunday Service will take place at each of the three churches in our benefice. This is a time when we will gather to remember all who died in

wars and conflicts of the past and present. In each parish, as part of our remembering, we will gather around the war memorials. The names of the fallen will be read and a two minute silence will be held as we remember.

When we look back over the past year, all of us will have different experiences, and in this month of remembrance we will have our own memories of the past.

Maybe you have lost loved ones or are someone who has experienced war first hand and live with the memories and scars of conflict. For many refugees who have fled their homeland, this is a reality. At this time, we remember the many Ukrainians who have come to live in the Benefice and give thanks for the hospitality and support they have received since they arrived.

This is a time when we remember those who have died and been scarred by war, and also a time when we are reminded that we need to learn from the past. Sadly, the world does not learn, and conflict is an ongoing reality.

It is because of love we remember. Many died fighting for peace giving their lives so we can live in peace. In the words of Jesus' commandment (John 15, verse 12) 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends.'

Planning applications

At time of drafting this newsletter there were 2 recent applications listed on the CDC website.

Walnut Farm, Bagpath, GL8 8YQ – lawful use of existing barn as a dwelling incorporating material alterations. Consultation expiry date 6.11.23

Linden House, Bagpath, GL8 8YQ – lawful proposed use of dwelling as a holiday let with addition of bifold doors and decking. Added to website on 6.10.23. Consultation expiry date not specified.

Note- Only applications classed by CDC as 'current', using the keyword Kingscote (i.e. the parish), and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Forerunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be around 21 days after validation of the application by CDC although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

If you are keen to keep abreast of all new planning applications, it is recommended that you check the CDC website regularly and/or register to receive email alerts direct from CDC. https://publicaccess.cotswold.gov.uk/online-applications/

Parish council update

Speeding and parking in Kingscote village: We have considered all the responses to the public consultation about traffic management proposals. At our meeting on 26 September we agreed a request for some SLOW signs on the road and white (H-lines) near the sharp corners, and these have been agreed by GCC Highways. We are also exploring the feasibility of installing some "20 is Plenty" signs.

Preparing for winter: GCC Highways have refilled most of the salt bins in the parish in preparation for winter. We are anticipating some new larger bins with lids for Kingscote village, to be placed near the lych gate and the village hall, and we have purchased a new bin to replace a damaged one in Bagpath. A reserve supply of bagged salt is also expected so that it would be possible to top up bins if we have a harsh winter. The salt might also be used with a new salt spreader which we purchased to improve safety for pedestrians in areas near the village hall and the war memorial.

Maintenance of village infrastructure: We are grateful to Steve Teague for his repair and refurbishment of the village notice board by the church. It seems that it had previously been held in place mainly by ivy!

GCC Highways have agreed to replace the rusting signpost near the postbox T-junction.

We have also made another request to GCC Highways about repairing the potholes on Scrubbetts Lane.

Community engagement with the Matara Centre

About 30 parishioners took part in the community event on Sunday 1 October at the Matara Centre and about half this number stayed for the 'Bring and share' lunch. Geoffrey Higgins explained his long-term vision for the grounds and Liam Latham discussed opportunities for volunteering to help with maintenance.

The next event is a training morning on Thursday 16 November, 10.30-13.00. There will be coffee and croissants at the Palm House from 10.30 and all are welcome to come for a chat whether or not they are volunteering.
