

VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

February saw the snowdrops, the first flowers of the year break through the winter soil and many people enjoyed a 'snowdrop walk' through Kingscote wood, to see the vast carpets of delicate white flowers. Delicious refreshments were also enjoyed in the Village Hall. Thank you to all who contributed cakes and served refreshments over the Snowdrop walk weekend.

Snowdrops are also called Candlemas bells and are symbolic of new life, new hope, beginnings, rebirth and resurrection. They flower around the time of the Christian festival of Candlemas. Candlemas, or the presentation of Jesus, is when we remember the story from the bible of Jesus being taken by Mary and Joseph to the temple at Jerusalem 40 days after his birth. He was recognised by an old man called Simeon as the one promised by God. On recognising Jesus, Simeon called him 'a light to the world.'



March is the first month of Spring, a month where we see change. As spring bursts into the world, we see daffodils blooming and further beginnings, of renewal and hope.

New beginnings come in all sorts of ways. We are now in the church season of Lent, and we look towards the coming of Easter and celebrating the resurrection of Jesus, a new beginning, the joy of new life, hope and light to the world.

The church is a special spiritual place to have a wedding and couples are looking forward to their Church wedding at St John the Baptist, to new beginnings as husband and wife. Parish Council Update

1. GCC Highways matters

- We now have a reserve supply of salt for the parish, and bins in Bagpath which
 had been missed have now been filled. We are expecting two new salt bins for
 Kingscote village soon.
- We have enquired about getting some '20 is plenty' signage in Kingscote, but apparently the Government guidance no longer allows any further such signs on the highway.

2. Ash dieback work for Bagpath Common

 Regrettably, GCC Highways Ash Dieback team are having to prioritise urgent work on more major roads and are not yet able to commit to a return visit to continue the work started last year.

3. Village Hall boundary wall

The wall between the village hall and the adjoining property (The Manor House)
needs rebuilding because it is leaning badly, and we are very grateful that the
Cotswold Voluntary Wardens have offered to undertake this.

4. Maintenance work in the parish

- The notice board in Bagpath has been removed for refurbishment.
- Councillors recently cleared the gutters of the bus shelter and the drain covers in Kingscote which were blocked by leaf debris.

5. Next meeting

The next meeting of Kingscote Parish Council will be on Tuesday 23 April 2024 at 7.30pm in the village hall. All parishioners are welcome to attend.
