VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Friends,


I am writing this letter in March. By the time April arrives, the church will have journeyed through the season of lent. On Palm Sunday we will have waved palms as we remembered Jesus coming into Jerusalem and journeyed through Holy week, to Jesus' death on the cross on Good Friday. We will have celebrated the joy of Easter Day, that great Christian festival celebrating Jesus' resurrection.

You may have given and received Easter eggs, as well as tasting wonderful, they bring a message as new life hatches from an egg, Jesus also came alive again on Easter day and Easter eggs remind us of new life.

The Easter season now continues as in the church we focus on Christ's resurrection and ascension and look towards the giving of the Holy Spirit, celebrated on the Day of Pentecost, this year on 19th May. Beginning in April, the churches in the Benefice will be running Alpha. What is Alpha? The word "Alpha" comes from the first letter of the Greek alphabet and symbolizes a beginning or starting point of a journey. Jesus refers to Himself in the bible as the Alpha and Omega, the first and the last. Alpha is about beginning, the course gives an opportunity to ask questions about spirituality and faith. At Alpha we will have a meal, this will be followed by a short film and then the discussion in small groups. There will be some key life questions to help with that conversation, but they are not restrictive. It is a safe space to ask questions and share thoughts you may have. Kerbside waste and recycling collections

The calendar for kerbside collection for 2024-25 was not available from the Cotswold District Council (CDC) website at the time of composing the Forerunner, but the web-page did state that there are no changes due to bank holidays so we presume the dates are as follows:

Food waste - every Thursday Recycling and garden waste -

Recycling centre

Pyke Quarry (Horsley tip) is open in the winter for pre-booked appointments. It is usually open from 10am to 4pm on all days except Wednesdays and it is open over the Easter bank holidays. Post office

The mobile post office will be at Kingscote Village Hall from 9am to 10am. every Monday and Thursday, apart from bank holidays.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

At time of drafting this newsletter there were no applications in the parish classed as 'current' and with a consultation expiry date during April listed on the Cotswold District Council website.

Note- Only applications classed by CDC as 'current', using the keyword Kingscote (i.e. the parish), and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Forerunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be around 21 days after validation of the application by CDC although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

If you are keen to keep abreast of all new planning applications, it is recommended that you check the CDC website regularly and/or register to receive email alerts direct from CDC.

Parish Council Update

1. GCC Highways matters.

The broken signpost at the junction of Barnhill Lane with the A4135 has been reported and added to the work schedule for 2024/25.

2. Village Hall boundary wall

The wall between the village hall and the adjoining property was leaning badly and we are very grateful that the Cotswold Voluntary Wardens are now rebuilding it. They make no charge for their labour so that the parish council only needs to pay for any new stone needed. Without this help the costs would have been prohibitive. In addition, Mrs Irene Ingleby-Oddy, who owns the adjacent property, has made a significant donation to cover most of the cost of the extra stone needed for a traditional 'cocks and hens' topping on the wall.

3. Maintenance work in the parish

Having renovated the notice board in Kingscote, Councillor Steve Teague has now used his woodworking skills to build a new notice board for Bagpath. We are very grateful for this support.
