# **Planning applications**

At time of drafting this newsletter the following planning application on the Cotswold District Council planning portal had a consultation deadline in August:

22 Kingscote GL8 8XY - proposed single storey extension to garage building to form home office. Consultation expiry date- 21.08.24

**Note-** Only applications classed by CDC as 'current', using the keyword Kingscote (i.e. the parish), and with relevant consultation expiry dates are included in The Forerunner each month. The standard consultation expiry date seems to be around 21 days after validation of the application by CDC although there are exceptions and sometimes applications do not seem to be listed on the website immediately after validation. Applications may not feature in the Forerunner if both the validation date and the expiry date fall in between Forerunner publications.

**Salt bins:** Two new salt bins have been provided near the church and the village hall.

**Potholes on Scrubbetts Lane.** Patching has been carried out on Scrubbetts Lane near Bagpath Common. Let's hope the repairs withstand the traffic and the weather.

We will now turn our attention to Hazlecote Lane and try to get some improvement of the road surface.


Thank you everyone who supported Pizza Night. It was very successful, both raising funds for the Village Hall and enjoyed by people who attended.
