

Looking at the mess in society which we see around us, even the simple set of rules contained in the Ten Commandments of the Old Testament would be helpful if people knew what they are

Our society is ruled by politicians and lawyers, but we have choices to make within that framework. God has created a magnificent universe, and it is our duty as the human race to make our little world a beautiful, happy and loving place.

For Summer has o'er-brimmed their clammy cells.


