# VICAR'S LETTER

### Dear Friends

We live in a troubled world where there is so much conflict and violence. A world where we see the lack of love and peace that Jesus teaches.

Christians across the world are invited to join in with 'Thy Kingdom Come" an annual ecumenical prayer movement that takes place from Ascension Day which fell on 29<sup>th</sup> May to Pentecost (8<sup>th</sup> June). This initiative invites Christians worldwide to pray for more people to come to know Jesus and the love and peace of Jesus' teachings.

### 1. Parish Council AGM

The Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council was held on May 13<sup>th</sup> in the village hall, immediately after the Annual Parish Meeting.

We approved all the financial and other documents required for the annual return and were pleased to accept a faultless internal audit report.

### 2. Village Hall Insurance

The AGM of the Village Hall Management Committee accepted an amendment to the Governing Document which reflects the current insurance arrangements. We have agreed that the Parish Council will continue to pay for the buildings insurance, and we have negotiated an improved rate with a 3 year tie-in.

### 3. GCC Highways

We are pleased that GCC Highways has agreed to more substantial road repairs in the Hazlecote Valley and Kingscote village during the 2025-26 financial year. We continue to pursue other matters in the parish which have been reported.

### 4. Next meeting

The next meeting of the parish council will be on Tuesday 8th July at 7.30pm in Kingscote village hall. All parishioners are welcome to attend.

### Seasonal recipes to tempt your palate:

Jane Lovett's Asparagus With Chopped Egg & Anchovy

#### Servings - 4

An elegant, pretty and very tasty way to serve asparagus, especially during the British asparagus season. Very good for lunch, or as part of a buffet, and it's very popular too!

#### Ingredients

- 2 fresh eggs ½ a shallot, finely chopped
- 1 tbsp small capers, drained
- 4 cocktail gherkins, chopped
- 2 anchovies, chopped
- 1 tbsp parsley and/or dill, chervil, chives, chopped
- a splash of olive oil
- salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1 kg (2lbs 4 oz) asparagus

#### Directions

- 1. Cook the eggs in boiling water for 6 minutes. Drain and run under cold water until cold. Peel, and finely chop. Mix in a bowl with the shallot, capers, gherkins, anchovies, herbs, a splash of olive oil and seasoning. Cover and set aside.
- 2. Bend the asparagus spears near their bases until they snap naturally, and discard the woody ends. (These can be used for making soup.) Steam, or cook the spears in a pan of well-salted boiling water, until just tender. Drain and plunge immediately into cold water, or sit under the running cold tap until cold. Spread out and wrap up in kitchen towel to dry.
- 3. Arrange the asparagus on a pretty platter, or individual plates and drizzle with a little olive oil. Top with the egg mixture and a last dribble of olive oil.

## Eastern\_Mess

Having spent almost all of my life in England, I am no stranger to Eton Mess. I like to believe that it was first created as a happy accident in a failed attempt at strawberry Pavlova at Eton College, although this is largely believed to be a myth. Over the years, I have made versions using every fruit imaginable and have added a variety of flavours to the cream. I don't mind admitting that some were less successful than others. This Eastern version is perfumed with Persian rosewater and combined with raspberries, basil and delicate pistachio slivers which give a little crunch to every bite.

#### SERVES 6

600ml (20fl oz) double cream

3 tbsp icing sugar

1 tsp vanilla bean paste or the seeds scraped from 1 vanilla pod

2 tbsp rosewater

6 ready-made meringues

450g(1lb) raspberries

handful of Greek basil leaves or torn basil leaves

75g (2¾oz) pistachio nut slivers or chopped pistachio nuts

For the Raspberry Sauce

225g(8oz) raspberries

1 tbsp icing sugar (you may need more if using raspberries out of season) 1 tbsp rosewater

squeeze of lemon juice

\* Using an electric hand whisk, whip the double cream, icing sugar, vanilla paste or seeds and rosewater together in a mixing bowl until soft peaks form. You don't want the cream to be too loose or too stiff, so keep an eye on the consistency. With the whisk set on a high speed, it should take about 3 minutes or so.

\* To make the sauce, mash the the raspberries to a purée with the icing sugar, rose water and lemon juice in a bowl until the mixture is completely smooth. Pass the mixture through a sieve to remove the raspberry seeds.

\* Choose either a large platter or individual serving dishes. Now layer the cream, meringues and raspberries in the serving dish(es), drizzling on the sauce and scattering over the basil leaves and pistachios as you go. Decorate the top layer with a little drizzle of sauce and a final scattering of basil leaves and pistachios. Serve immediately.
