Dear Friends

It was such a wonderful occasion on Sunday 20th July, as we celebrated Rosemary receiving the Kyneburga long service award for serving the life of the Church in Kingscote. This special recognition means that Rosemary is now a member of the Company of Saint Kyneburga.

But who was Saint Kyneburga?

Saint Kyneburga was the co-foundress and abbess in the eighth century of the first religious community at what is now Gloucester Cathedral. The association with Kyneburga is a reminder that those who are honoured for their service today are the latest in a long line going back 1300 years of those who have built up, maintained and enriched the life of the Church in Gloucestershire.









A full church for this celebration reflected Rosemary's valued dedication and service. Thank you to everyone who made this service so special.

The children helped to act out the bible story of the parable of the talents. In this parable, a man gave his servants talents, different amounts of gold to invest whilst he was away. Two of the servants invested wisely and got a good return for their investment, but the third buried the gold, hiding it in the ground for fear of losing it. In this parable, the gold stands not just for money, but for our God given talents and skills. It is with great thanks that Rosemary didn't hide her talent, but invested her time, and with dedication and commitment developed her skill in playing the organ and using this to support Church worship for over half a century.

KINGSCOTE PARISH COUNCIL

1. Village Hall Replastering

The parish council has approved a grant of £750 to the village hall committee to cover the second part of the lime replastering. The funds are provided from the Community Infrastructure Levy.

2. GCC Highways

Some road repairs were carried out on Hazlecote Lane on 21st July, but the repairs requested in Kingscote village remain to be done. The council is liaising with GCC Highways about the possibility of SLOW signs on the road to Bagpath from Hunters Hall and improving the signage near Ashel Barn.

3. Next meeting

The next meeting of the parish council will be on Tuesday 9th September at 7.30pm in Kingscote village hall. All parishioners are welcome to attend.


After more than 10 years of lovingly putting together The Forerunner digital newsletter, Steve Tattersall and Alice Cooper are ready to pass on the baton.

I have received the following letter from a resident of Kingscote who is concerned about the dangers of bonfires and asked for it to be published in this month's magazine:

I thought it might be of interest to all residents of Kingscote to remind them of certain aspects of Kingscote's location that affects them all.

The prevailing wind at Kingscote is South Westerly and therefore it carries all it contains directly to Kingscote's Woodlands and all houses in its path.

The polite message put on the Kingscote App (read by about 50 people) asked the culprits of two bonfires to stop having fires but did not spell out the reason for the request. The response 'We waited until 9.30pm to light the fire' seems to indicate that the culprits were completely unaware of the dangers and discomfort caused.

The bonfire on Wednesday 18th June was lit soon after 8pm and carried high dense smoke directly to tinder dry Kingscote Woodlands and dense smoke into all houses north of the fire.

The bonfire on Sunday evening 29th June again produced dense smoke heading for the Woodlands and again carried dense grey smoke into houses in its path.

Although neighbours convey to each other how distressing it is to have a house full of smoke coupled with the worry of the smoke carrying a spark to the tinder dry Woodlands there is a reluctance to mention this directly to the culprits.

Bonfires cause the same problems even in winter the smoke and all that is carried with it heads for the Woodlands and it still enters all the homes in its path.

There is a free tip a few miles away at Horsley for safe disposal of garden waste which is used by many and a Green Bin can be hired from Cotswold District Council for £69 a year a small price to pay for such convenience. For those who find it difficult to meet the cost CDC will even consider subsidising its provision, and of course there are the Waste collectors licensed to carry away waste for safe disposal. If there is an excess of waste at one point of the year it can easily be stored in large plastic bags and takes little time to refill the bin each time it is emptied.

We have had lots of warnings, the huge loss of property in the USA and Australia and a fire in Scotland and UK news items asking people to take care, and now helicopter pilots are being trained to deal with wildfires.

Please, everyone, keep Kingscote fire and smoke free.
