VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

February is a month when the days start to feel a little longer and we can spot the first signs of spring appearing around us. In the Church calendar, February also brings the closing weeks of the church season of Epiphany, when we remember the wise men following the star that led them to Jesus.

Epiphany ends on 2 February with the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple. Mary and Joseph bring the baby Jesus to the Temple, where they meet Simeon, a faithful and patient man who had been promised that he would see the Messiah before he died.

Simeon recognises who Jesus truly is and describes him as "a light to lighten the Gentiles and the glory of God's people Israel" — a light bringing hope and joy to everyone. This day is also known as Candlemas, reminding us that Jesus is the Light of the world.

February is also the time for pancakes! Pancakes are traditionally eaten on Shrove Tuesday, the day before Lent begins. This year, Shrove Tuesday falls on Tuesday 18 February. The custom grew from the practice of using up rich ingredients such as eggs, milk, and butter before the start of Lent, and it has become a joyful opportunity to gather, share food, and enjoy fellowship before the more reflective season of Lent.

Shrove Tuesday is followed by Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of Lent — a season of prayer, self-reflection, and preparation for Easter.

Whether February for you is a time of enjoying those pancakes, taking time for prayer and reflection, or simply noticing the signs of spring as we approach Easter, may the weeks ahead bring moments of warmth, connection and hope.

KINGSCOTE PARISH COUNCIL

1. GCC Highways

Road repairs: GCC Highways filled some of the worst potholes on Bagpath Lane in January. We recognize that the task of repairing roads is never-ending and are grateful that this lane has been given some attention but will continue to press for a more enduring improvement.

Road safety and signage: We will be requesting an additional SLOW sign on Barnhill Lane just before Windy Corner and a new No Through Road sign for Back Lane in Kingscote. We are still awaiting proposals which might improve safety on the A4135 near Hunters Hall where there are multiple junctions.

Ash dieback on Bagpath Common: A considerable number of diseased ash trees were toppled by the high winds recently and one tree was left precariously suspended on another because it was resting on a BT Openreach cable. We have asked for a review of the policies of BT Openreach and GCC Highways to avoid a similar dangerous situation occurring in future.

2. Village Hall broadband

We have arranged with Gigaclear for fibre broadband in the village hall. The service is fully operational in the main hall where the download and upload speeds exceed the contractual 100Mbps. We have asked for an additional node in the Reynolds Room since the wifi signal is not penetrating the thick stone wall between the two rooms.

3. Parish Council precept for 2026/27

We have decided that the parish precept for 2026/27 should be £5973 which is an increase of 5.3% on last year. The increase includes an allowance for village hall broadband which was previously provided free by Voneus.

4. Next meeting

The next meeting of the parish council will be on Tuesday 10th March at 7.30pm in Kingscote village hall. All parishioners are welcome to attend.

I would be very grateful if you would place a note in the next Forerunner on my behalf with many thanks.




